Examination season

The examination season has begun for both Year 12 and Year 13 students. We have been impressed with the amount of focus students have had on achieving their very best and hope that this continues. We have conducted a number of wellbeing sessions to support students to look after their wellbeing throughout this testing time and have a representative from Teen Health accessible every Monday in the Sixth Form Centre should students require additional support. Students have also received an electronic document listing places where they can receive support should they require it out of school hours.

Year 12 UCAS cycle

All Year 12 students are expected to prepare a UCAS application regardless of whether they intend on submitting this to universities. Each year, we see students change their mind once the deadline for equal consideration has passed and by having prepared an application, we can ensure that there is a seamless process should this be the case. Year 12 will now be guided through the Personal Development Curriculum to complete this but must take responsibility for working on this in their study periods and at home.

Year 12 UCAS exhibition trip

Letters will be coming out shortly regarding a fully funded trip to a UCAS exhibition in Nottingham. We expect that all Year 12 students attend this as a vital part of their careers education. The exhibition allows students to meet numerous university and apprenticeship providers in one location. This allows students to make direct comparisons between courses and providers without the expense and time of travel across the country. Students are then able to short list institutions that they wish to visit on Open Days.

Lionheart PRIDE event

Students are able to access the annual Lionheart PRIDE event, being held this year at The Cedars Academy, Birstall. If students would like to attend, the trip is fully funded and students need to express an interest with Ms Major in HH08. This event is quickly filling up, so we encourage students to notify Ms Major as a matter of urgency if they wish to participate.
