### Preparing for exam season

Students in both year groups are now looking ahead towards the summer formal exam season. With Year 13 sitting their terminal examinations in all subjects and Year 12 sitting trial examinations and national modular examinations, all students are required to remain focused on achieving their very best. Students in both year groups have been provided with a revision planner and textbook that details how best to revise in a variety of subjects as well as the importance of looking after their wellbeing during this stressful time. At the back of the textbook, there are spaces for students to identify their confidence levels with topics within each of their subject areas as well as weekly revision planning documents for them to identify what work they will complete and when.

Alongside this, our Exam bitesize curriculum continues every Thursday morning during registration which allows students to discover the power of Metacognition and the importance of understanding and reflecting upon the best ways for them to learn.

Please do encourage your child to engage with this textbook and have discussions with them around the planning and preparation they are doing for all examinations.

Interventions for both Year 12 and Year 13 are also now live with bespoke programmes of support in place as identified by students' subject teachers. We know that every moment matters in school and guide our Sixth Form students to utilize not only the time they have with us, but the access they have to highly trained subject specialists.

#### Sutton Trust Summer School

The Sutton Trust Summer School Programme offers Year 12 students the opportunity to immerse themselves in university life. Students report that they have been able to develop their confidence and skills needed to choose where to apply and what to study, be competitive applicants wherever that is, and find support with a network of like-minded peers. In order to be eligible, students need to:

- Attend a state funded school
- Currently be in Year 12
- Students are prioritised based on a range of social mobility criteria including eligibility for free school meals, and the context of their school and neighbourhood

Applications close on 7<sup>th</sup> March so students need to act quick on this one!
