Focus and preparation

Throughout the month, we have invested heavily in ensuring that our Sixth Form students are best prepared for lessons, study time and the quality of the work they are undertaking outside of the school day. With this in mind, we continue to offer an extended hours service of 8am-4.30pm each day in the Sixth Form Centre for students to utilise the learning environment beyond their lessons. Focus and preparation are key to the success of our students and our designated areas in the new Sixth Form Centre allow them to focus and practice the skills of knowledge retrieval, consolidation and application to examination conditions.

In addition to this, we have now opened a 'Past Paper Library' in the Sixth Form Centre for students to access past papers from the last five years for each of our curriculum areas. In order to prepare our students to utilise the additional resources that support excellent outcomes, next month our students will be learning how to use academic sources in their study time and how to reference appropriately across a range of subjects. Heads of Faculties are also working on supporting documents that break down the type of activities that students can be undertaken at different times of their working day – in silent study, in study periods, at home and wider reading to support getting the best grades possible.

We have also been providing your child with 'examination bitesize' sessions where students are able to discover the science behind learning and apply these strategies to their own revision. We have also been sending these out to parents so we do encourage you to listen to them if you haven't already so you can discuss these with your child. Topics have included: Metacognition and how our memory works, spaced retrieval, preparing for trial exams and consolidation of information.

Of course, this only works if students are actively engaging with the considerable support that is being provided alongside using their study time appropriately. Please do continue to encourage your child to access these fantastic resources and we hope that they provide support and guidance to you.

Sixth Form weekly rundown

Each Friday, students are emailed with a weekly rundown of messages and notices for the week ahead. Through this, our students are also sent opportunities and careers links for further research and reading. Our full time Careers Advisor is available to book through our Sixth Form Tutors and some students have begun to make use of this system. Some of the opportunities we have sent this month are:

IntoUniversity is a service that provides local learning centres where young people are inspired to achieve. They offer a safe space for students to learn, explore and succeed in a welcoming and supportive home-from-home environment. As a partnership school, we have access to their facilities and their academic support. They run sessions for free with friendly, trained staff on Monday's and Thursday's 4-5.30pm at Barley Croft Community Centre LE4 OUT. This programme is run in collaboration with the University of Leicester and DeMontfort University and if students are able to attend, we would highly suggest they participate.
